

## **Pupil Premium Grant 2018-2019**

### **What is the Pupil Premium?**

The Pupil Premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities to diminish the differences between them and their peers.

### **Key Priority:**

The Pupil Premium Grant is designed to help disadvantaged pupils of all abilities perform better, and close the gap between them and their peers.

### **What do we expect to see?**

As a school, we continuously identify and monitor individual children and groups of children to consider what they need to learn effectively and succeed at school. We are committed to using evidence and research to select the most effective strategies for increasing progress and attainment.

### **Our school's Pupil Premium Grant allocation amount:**

In the 2018 to 2019 financial year, schools will receive the following funding for each pupil registered as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years:

- £1,320 for pupils in Reception to Year 6
- Schools will receive £2,300 for any pupil identified in the January 2018 school census or the alternative provision census as having left local authority care as a result of:
  - adoption
  - a special guardianship order
  - a child arrangements order (previously known as a residence order)
  - who has been in local authority care for 1 day or more
  - recorded as both eligible for FSM in the last 6 years and as being looked after (or as having left local authority care)

### **Pupil Premium Funding in our school over the past 3 years**

Pupil Premium Funding April 2016 – March 2017 Income **£35,900 (inc PP+)**

Pupil Premium Funding April 2017- March 2018 **£35,320 (inc PP+)**

Pupil Premium Funding April 2018 - March 2019 **£26,020 (inc PP+)**



### **Barriers to Learning:**

At Stanford Infant School, we provide a proactive holistic approach to every child's needs. Maslow's hierarchy of need demonstrates the importance of fulfilling a child's basic needs before they can achieve their full potential; we are committed to fulfilling those needs in order for children to achieve lifelong success.

Some of our vulnerable learners enter school with social, emotional and mental health needs and/or speech, language and communication needs. We work hard to address these needs early. Sometimes they have additional Special Educational Needs too.

### **Spending the Pupil Premium:**

A full report of how we have spent the Pupil Premium Grant is available on our website or a copy can be requested from the School Office.

The Pupil Premium Report and accompanying documents detail how the grant has been spent for the educational benefit of the children eligible for Pupil Premium funding at the school. The school ensures that the grant is not only used to 'close the gap' between eligible pupils and their peers, but also to raise the progress and attainment of disadvantaged pupils.

### **Summary of Pupil Premium Funding:**

As outlined above, the interventions in place to support pupils in receipt of the Pupil Premium, have had a marked impact on pupil's progress and achievement, both academically and socially – see Pupil Premium Report 2017-2018.

**In 2018-2019, we will...**

- Ensure provision is tailored to meet individual needs;
- Ensure that disadvantaged pupils are supported during lessons to ensure they are focussed and engaged at all times;
- Ensure good or better progress in Reading and Writing through the Every Child a Reader (ECaR) programme and FFT Wave 3 Intervention;
- Ensure good or better progress in Mathematics through 1<sup>st</sup> Class @ Number programme and other Maths Support;
- Actively support the needs of vulnerable pupils with social, emotional and behavioural issues through our Learning Mentor and School Councillor;
- Ensure disadvantaged pupils have the opportunity to attend a range of extra-curricular activities;
- Ensure all disadvantaged learners enjoy trips and visits;
- Ensure all disadvantaged pupils have access to snacks and midmorning milk to promote a healthy lifestyle.

**How we will measure the impact of the Pupil Premium:**

We continue to measure progress and achievement for all disadvantaged pupils and monitor rigorously the impact of any interventions.

**The date of the next review of the school's pupil premium strategy:**

Our Pupil Premium Report for 2017-2018 has been published following the release on Analyse School Performance data. The next review will take place at the end of this academic year.
