Privacy Notice for the School Workforce - How we use Staff Information

Who Processes Your Information?

Stanford Infant School is the data controller of the personal information you provide to us. This means the school determines the purposes for which, and the manner in which, any personal data relating to staff is to be processed.

Where necessary, third parties may be responsible for processing staff members' personal information. Where this is required, the school places data protection requirements on third party processors to ensure data is processed in line with staff members' privacy rights.

Why Do We Need Your Information?

Stanford Infant School has the legal right and a legitimate interest to collect and process personal data relating to those we employ to work at the school, or those otherwise contracted to work at the school. We process personal data in order to meet the safeguarding requirements set out in UK employment and childcare law, including those in relation to the following:

- School Staffing (England) Regulations 2009 (as amended)
- Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006
- The Childcare (Disqualification) Regulations 2009

Staff members' personal data is also processed to assist in the running of the school, and to enable individuals to be paid.

If staff members fail to provide their personal data, there may be significant consequences. This includes the following:

Employment Checks:

Failure to provide the school with ample proof of a right to work in the UK will prevent employment at name of school.

Employees found to be working illegally could face prosecution by law enforcement officers.

Salary Requirements:

Failure to provide accurate tax codes and/or national insurance numbers could lead to issues of delayed payments or an employee paying too much tax.

For Which Purposes Are Your Personal Data Processed?

In accordance with the above, staff members' personal data is used for the following reasons:

- Contractual Requirements.
- Employment Checks, e.g. Right to Work in the UK.
- Salary Requirements.

Which Data is Collected?

The personal data the school will collect from the school workforce includes the following:

- Personal Information (name, address, contact details, employee/teacher number, national insurance number).
- Characteristic (such as gender, age, ethnic group).
- Contract Information (start date, hours worked, post, roles, salary).
- Qualifications.
- Absence Information (absences and reasons).
- Medical Information.

[NB. The above list is exhaustive]

The collection of personal information will benefit both the DfE and LA by:

- Improving the management of workforce data across the sector.
- Enabling the development of a comprehensive picture of the workforce and how it is deployed.
- Informing the development of recruitment and retention policies.
- Allowing better financial modelling and planning.
- Enabling ethnicity and disability monitoring.
- Supporting the work of the school teachers' review body.

Will Your Personal Data Be Sought From Third Parties?

Staff members' personal data is only sought from the data subject. No third parties will be contacted to obtain staff members' personal data without the data subject's consent.

Staff members' personal data may be obtained and processed from third parties where the law requires the school to do so, e.g. medical records from a GP. The categories of data obtained and processed from third parties include:

- Pre-Employment References.
- DBS Application.

Where data is obtained from third parties, the personal data originates from the following sources:

- DfE Prohibition Check – originally provided by educating body.
- DBS Police Checks.

How Is Your Information Shared?

Stanford Infant School will not share your personal information with any third parties without your consent, unless the law allows us to do so.

We are required, by law, to pass on some personal information to our LA and the DfE.

The workforce information that we lawfully share with the DfE through data collections:

- Informs the DfE's policy on pay and the monitoring of the effectiveness and diversity of the school workforce.
- Links to school funding and expenditure.
- Supports longer term research and monitoring of educational policy.

As the employer, the LA is provided with staff members' data in the interest of:

- Payroll
- Human Resources
- Absence Management
- Occupational Health

How long is your Data Retained for?

Staff members' personal data is retained in line with Brighton and Hove Council's retention policy of 7 years after the employment end date.

Personal information may be retained for the following periods depending on the nature of the information. Data will only be retained for as long as is necessary to fulfil the purposes for which it was processed, and will not be retained indefinitely.

If you require further information regarding retention of data, and the periods for which your personal data is held for, please speak to the Office Manager, Hannah Parker.

What Are Your Rights?

As the data subject, you have specific rights to the processing of your data.

You have a legal right to:

- Request access to the personal data that Stanford Infant School holds.
- Request that your personal data is amended.
- Request that your personal data is erased.
- Request that the processing of your data is restricted.

Where the processing of your data is based on your explicit consent, you have the right to withdraw this consent at any time. This will not affect any personal data that has been processed prior to withdrawing consent.

Staff members also have the right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) in relation to how Stanford Infant School processed their personal data.
